Today's craft: Communicating Elephant Puppet



You will need:

- » Elephant template (attached)
- » Gray or black crayons
- » Scissors
- » Googly eyes
- » 3 Fasteners
- » Sharp point to make holes
- » Tongue depressor
- » Scotch tape

Directions:

- 1. Color the elephant's body, ears and trunks
- 2. Cut all the pieces out.
- 3. Make holes where indicated (an adult should help you do this)
- 4. Fasten the ears and trunk to the body, using the fasteners.
- 5. Put on two googly eyes.
- 6. Stick the tongue depressor to your elephant's back.
- 7. Now your elephants can move its ears and trunk to communicate to other members of the herd!
